REPORT FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE Brad Bauman – Emergency Preparedness, Chair of EP Committee

Broader EP protocols. All principals have an EP manual. Each school has a site based critical incident response team that do annual reviews.

EP Committee working to align new procedures around hold and secure are not reflected in manual. Also needing to align with current approach from Delta Police and Delta Fire.

Brad requested feedback and issues from parents. What topics would you see presented to parents on EP? Are there any bigger topics on EP (community lens)?

Brad will prepare feedback as a Google form.

Q: What is Parent responsibility for bin vs. District – (ie. recent break-ins)?

A: District is struggling. No contingency plan for replacement. Facilities have been trying different lock. Parents generally provide food and comfort elements. Equipment for a longer term response, generators, tools etc. is sometimes paid for schools, sometimes parents. This is being discussed now at the EP table.

Q: What about community funding?

A: No funding from the City. Conversations with Fire and Police – in the event of an emergency, resources would be pooled. There is an incident command center – to be moved to the new fire hall near Boundary Bay fire hall. SD would have people there. SD also has a command center at the SD offices. SD can communicate with all schools through a radio system that rallies through Seymour. Last year a large-scale simulation took place. The SD was involved – all community partners. There are variables.

Laura Dixon: All EP material is on the website (facilities). Parents have worked in an *ad hoc* basis with the SD to talk about top priorities and approach. The question has been asked of the Ministry – why are parents paying? Schools/parents can by through FAST. Priority – Emergency release forms are accurately filled out – especially local support, i.e., neighbours or friends to pick up.

Q: What about continuity in parents (turnover)?

A: District responsibility to facilitate the passing of the information. How do we train parents and staff? What is the most effective method? Constant struggle for maintenance of a minimum standard.

Q: With the recent windstorm, there was some confusion for parent response. Depending on the event, do we call the City, do we call the school etc.? What is the process for informing parents?

A: Email fan first, sometimes through a school, sometimes through the SD. Through SD, it takes up to 50 minutes. It is quicker for SD to direct the schools to mass email, and easier for SD to follow up. SD does not have an emergency text network. SD office is on generators and redundancy in networks. Sands has the redundant system. The SD should/will put something together for parents (redundancy of information).

Q: Are parents supposed to have been informed if Codes have been called?

A: They are supposed to be informed by the schools.

REPORT FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE Doug Sheppard – Report on Graduation Rates

Report on provincial results – completion results. Consistently measured data every year by the province. Results go back to 2002. Provincial graduation rate 89%. Metro 92%. Delta rate 96% last year. BC stats only (not international). Indigenous ancestry 40% (2002 province). Delta 77% (2018 small cohort).
