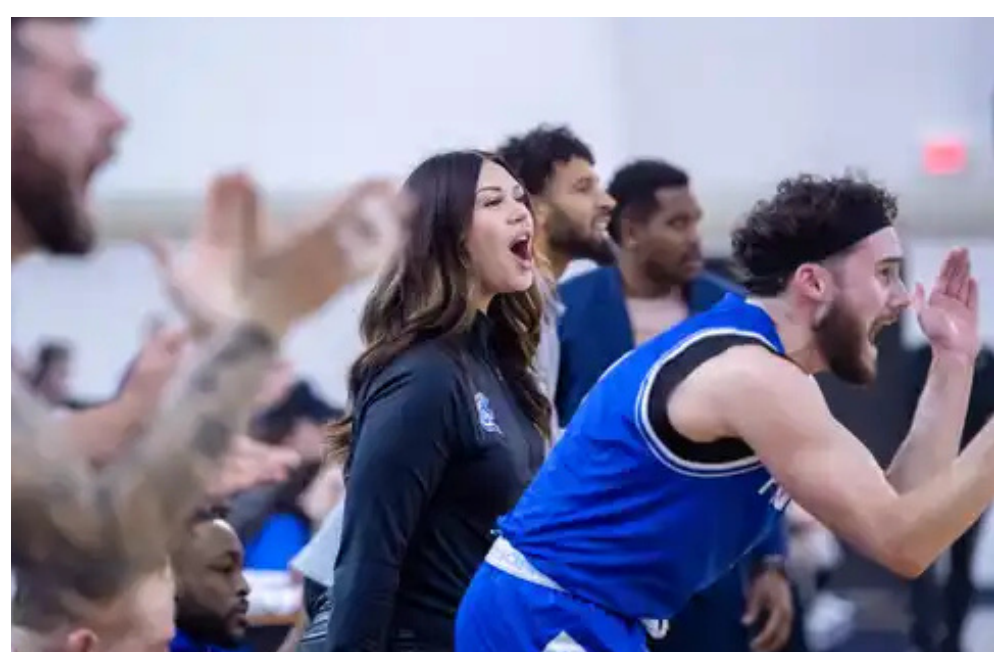

It will also highlight that the differences in the human experience between youth and their parents/caregivers is not as great as what many believe. About the Presenter:

Madison is a Youth Specialist at the Center for Trauma Informed Practices as well as the Assistant Men's Basketball Coach at the University of Lethbridge. She is a former university athlete who spent her college basketball career playing in Michigan and Georgia. Madison's early experience as an Educational Assistant, Crisis Intervention Worker, and Community Support Leader laid an early foundation for this work. Madison has also had ongoing opportunities collaborating with youth organizations across Canada and the United States.

Madison and the CTIP Team have developed a series of comprehensive presentations for professionals, parents, and caregivers focused on the mental, emotional, and behavioural aspects that youth are facing due to the impact of Social Media use. This work was inspired by Madison's personal exposure to Social Media growing up as well as the many experiences she has had supporting children and youth as they face their own difficulties through Social Media engagement. Madison also offers youth presentations with a message of "Staying True to Yourself" in the midst of Social Media Influences.
